



**Report on the Activities Conducted During the First Half of the 2025–2026 Academic Year

1	Activation of the Activities of the Voluntary Student Club “Sanaly Urpaq”	<p>From 1 to 20 September 2025, the University conducted a series of activities aimed at activating the work of the voluntary student club “Sanaly Urpaq.”</p> <p>Key results:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Information and awareness-raising activities were carried out among 1st- and 3rd-year students in order to attract new members to the club. 2. As a result of these activities, up to 15% of the total number of students from the indicated academic years were recruited into the club. 3. Following the recruitment campaign, the number of club members increased as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> in the 2024–2025 academic year, the club consisted of 140 students; in the 2025–2026 academic year, the number of participants increased to 210 students. <p>Thus, a positive trend in expanding the membership of the “Sanaly Urpaq” student club was observed.</p>	1st–2nd year students (210 people)	 



2 Organization of a Unified Hour Dedicated to Integrity and Academic Honesty	<p>From 2 to 4 September 2025, within the framework of the traditional “Freshman Week”, lectures entitled “Formation of the Principles of Integrity and Anti-Corruption Culture” were held at Karaganda Technical University. The lectures were organized by the Department of the Assembly of the People of Kazakhstan and Social and Humanitarian Disciplines.</p> <p>Objectives of the events:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • fostering stable values of honesty, fairness, and responsibility among students; • increasing the level of students' anti-corruption culture; • familiarizing first-year students with the fundamental principles of academic integrity, the University's internal regulatory documents, and rules of conduct. <p>During the lectures, students were introduced to materials on the following topics:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Student Code of Honor; • Anti-Corruption Standard; • Role of the Ethics Council; • Activities of the “Sanaly Urpaq” student club; • Concept of the “Territory of Integrity”; • issues of discipline, compliance with academic ethics, and protection of university property. <p>Lecture schedule:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 2 September 2025 — the lecture was delivered by Department Lecturer Kayyrbek 	3,000 students (entire 1st-year cohort)

3	<p>Participation in the “Anti-Corruption Volunteering” Project Youth Student Campaign “No to Corruption!”</p> <p>From 16 to 22 October 2025, within the framework of the “Anti-Corruption Volunteering” project, the youth campaign “No to Corruption!” was held at Abylkas Saginov Karaganda Technical University. The campaign was aimed at forming students’ strong rejection of corruption and developing anti-corruption thinking.</p> <p>The campaign was conducted with the purpose of forming and strengthening an anti-corruption culture in the student environment, as well as promoting the principles of honesty, openness, and fairness.</p> <p>The main objectives of the event were:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • development of civic responsibility and intolerance toward corruption among students; • increasing young people’s awareness of anti-corruption values; • engaging students in socially beneficial activities and fostering personal responsibility. 	<p>1st–3rd year students (2,000 people)</p>

4	<p>Implementation of the Social Partnership Program with Student Organizations and Development of Student Self-Government</p> <p>From 31 October to 12 November 2025, the “Sanaly Urpaq” student club of the Department of the Assembly of the People of Kazakhstan and Social and Humanitarian Disciplines of Abylkas Saginov Karaganda Technical University (Non-Profit Joint-Stock Company) held an interuniversity essay contest entitled “Honesty Begins with Me.” The purpose of the contest was to foster principles of honesty, fairness, and personal responsibility among students, as well as to enhance legal awareness and develop an anti-corruption culture.</p> <p>A total of 50 essays were submitted by students from three universities of the Karaganda region: Abylkas Saginov Karaganda Technical University, Karaganda National Research University named after Academician E.A. Buketov, and Karaganda Industrial University. Students from 1st to 5th academic years representing various faculties participated</p>	<p>1st–5th year students (50 people)</p>	

in the contest, demonstrating a strong interest in issues related to anti-corruption culture.

The evaluation of the essays was conducted in accordance with approved criteria, including originality and uniqueness of ideas, relevance to the topic, depth of analysis and argumentation, literacy, text structure, emotional impact, and compliance with technical requirements. Essays created using artificial intelligence or containing signs of plagiarism were not admitted for evaluation.

Based on the results of the contest, the winners were determined.



5 Video Contest “Anti-Corruption: The Youth Perspective” Implementation of the Social Partnership Program with Student Organizations and Development of Student Self-Government	<p>Within the framework of implementing the Social Partnership Program with Student Organizations and developing student self-government, the “Sanaly Urpaq” student club of Abylkas Saginov Karaganda Technical University conducted a video contest entitled “Anti-Corruption: The Youth Perspective” among students of higher education institutions of the city of Karaganda from 1 to 12 December 2025.</p> <p>The purpose of the contest was to foster an anti-corruption culture, develop civic engagement among young people, and increase intolerance toward manifestations of corruption.</p> <p>Students from higher education institutions of the city of Karaganda took part in the contest, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Karaganda National Research University named after Academician E.A. Buketov; • Abylkas Saginov Karaganda Technical University. <p>The contest featured original socially oriented video works. The evaluation of submissions was carried out according to the following criteria: relevance to the topic, originality of the idea, quality of execution, social significance, and creative approach.</p> <p>Based on the results of the contest, winners who took 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places were determined. the University for undergraduate and master's students, with the participation of **Satkenov Akylbek Satkenovich**, a lecturer of the **Department of the Assembly of the People of Kazakhstan and Social and Humanitarian Disciplines**, and **Kayyrbek Meruert Sabitkyzy**, Head of the "Sanaly Urpaq" student club.

The purpose of the anti-corruption activities was to educate patriotic and competitive young people with an anti-corruption worldview, oriented toward a *достой* life in Kazakhstan.

During the meeting, the following issues were discussed: the concept of corruption and its types, the anti-corruption legislation of the Republic of Kazakhstan and the stages of its development, the causes of corruption in higher education institutions, as well as ways of forming an anti-corruption culture in the student environment.
